SAMHSA/CSAP's Proposed National CAPT Web site Design and Functionality

2/2/2004

The proposed National CAPT Web site will incorporate several autonomous and distinct sites into one site. The goal is to allow each CAPT to maintain its content hierarchy independent of the other CAPTs while at the same time presenting a unified and cohesive user experience.

Statement of Purpose

The purpose of SAMHSA/CSAP's National CAPT Web site (www.captus.samhsa.gov) is

- To provide consistent information on the CAPT project at the national and regional levels.
- To serve as a comprehensive portal to CSAP CAPT resources maintained by each of the five CAPT regions for regional outreach. This will extend the reach and benefit of CSAP's CAPTs to the national prevention field.
- To facilitate reporting and collaboration among CSAP/SAMHSA and the CAPTs through use of a password-protected staff Web site that includes a variety of interactive Web-based tools.
- To leverage the cost-benefits that can be gleaned from sharing tools, resources, ideas, and products across CAPT regions.

This document illustrates some of the pieces of general functionality and design for the proposed Web site. The colors, graphics, and photos in these mockups may change, and are used only as temporary placeholders.

captUS: Home Page

The CAPT logo and title will appear at the top of all public pages. Users will always be able to get back to this home page by clicking on the logo or the "National" link. This will help to convey a sense of branding and unification across the site.

These links represent the main content sections (top-level sub navigation) of the National CAPT. Each CAPT section will have its own sub navigation. The main content sections for each CAPT region may or may not be consistent. These sections may expand when clicked on to reveal sub level navigation sections.

The global footer will appear at the bottom of all public site pages.

The search engine will be accessible from every page.

The primary global navigation elements will allow the user to link to other CAPT sections at anytime.

The secondary global navigation elements will also be present on every page.


This content will be displayed dynamically if there are any CSAP live sessions occurring today.

This content will be displayed dynamically based on the calendar. If there are any public events occurring today, they will be listed here.

CAPT News will be generated dynamically from the News content of each CAPT's section. The latest news item will be drawn from each CAPT and displayed here. The news items on this page will be sorted by date added.

When a user clicks on the "About the CAPT System" link they will be taken to the top page of that section. Additional sub pages are now revealed in the left hand navigation column.

The navigation is designed to be highly scalable and flexible by easily accommodating additional sections/links.



captUS: 3rd Level (tertiary) Page

When a user clicks on the "Process" link they will be taken to a third level page. If an additional level of content existed below this page, additional navigation would be present within the body of this page. This navigation would be in the form of either inline linking or a contextual navigation menu.

Kevin Pyles is the moderator for this session. Mr. Pyles is a computer specialist with more than seventeen years of experience in relational database design. captUS: Calendar

The calendar can be viewed in day, week, month, or year view.

The public calendar will be fed by the events that are entered into the calendar in the CAPT Staff section. When CAPT staff add events to the calendar, they will specify whether events should be displayed publicly or only in the staff section.



captUS: CAPT Regional Sections

The site is designed to combine several distinctive CAPT sections into one cohesive Web site. Each CAPT will have it's own unique color scheme, but follow the same general design template. This will help to create the look and feel of separate sections (or sub sites) within one larger site.

Each CAPT will have it's own unique sub navigation sections. Each section can be expanded to reveal additional sub sections/ links.



The global header is also carried across to the regional CAPT sections. Keeping the global elements tucked away unobtrusively at the top of the page allows the CAPT regions to maximize the use of the page real estate.

Each CAPT will have the ability to post recent news and links on their landing (top-level) page. The latest news item from each CAPT will be pulled onto the National home page.

captUS: Staff Area

The CAPT Staff area will be accessible by clicking on the "Staff Login" link from the public site.

Access to the staff area will be dependent upon a verified user name and password.

The Staff area will feature a variety of tools and systems, including; Contact Management, Calendar, File Sharing, Data Collection System, CSAP Live Administration, Course Builder Tool, and CAPT Web site Administration. A user's access to these various tools will be dependent upon their security/access level. For example, some users may only have access to the Contacts, Calendar, File Sharing, and Data Collection. While some users will have access to all the tools. In addition some users may have only view/read access to a tool, and other users will have full/edit access.
